


Zookeepers are animal professionals. They are responsible for maintaining the health and living conditions of the animals. They have many duties and are often very busy! Some of their duties include:

- Giving medication
- Recording their behaviours

Zookeepers don't have an easy job. They can be harmed by animals as they may be frightened or not accustomed to human contact. Their job is very demanding.

Zoo animals come from various parts of the world. Zoos give people an opportunity to observe animals that they would never otherwise get the chance to see.

The first ever zoo was called the Mengaerie du Jardin des Plantes. It was founded in Paris, France in 1794. Since then, most major cities have zoos and many of them work together to care for, study and protect their animals.
