Past continuous tense is something that continuously happened in the past.

- I was washing the dishes.
- He was walking to school.
- She was drawing a picture.

Past continuous tense is made by the past tense of the verb to be (was/were) with the main verb added with 'ing'.

When asking a question in past continuous tense, we should start with the verb to be (was/were) followed by the pronoun then the main verb.

- Was he walking the dog?
- Were they playing football?
