

Past Continuous Tense #1

Past continuous tense is something that continuously happened in the past.

- I **was** washing the dishes.
- He **was** walking to school.
- She **was** drawing a picture.

Past continuous tense is made by the past tense of the verb to be (was/were) with the main verb added with 'ing'.

I was	singing
You were	playing
He was	watching
She was	kicking
It was	walking
We were	making
They were	writing

When asking a question in past continuous tense, we should start with the verb to be (was/were) followed by the pronoun then the main verb.

- **Was** he walking the dog?
- **Were** they playing football?
