The verb "to be" is a verb used to describe something or someone. In English, it can be used to say different things according to the context.

However, the most common use of the to be verb is to talk about names, age, feeling, nationalities, and professions.

For present tense, we use 'am' for first person singular, 'is' for third person singular and 'are' for third person plural.
