

Antarctica can be found in the South Pole, surrounded by the Southern Ocean. It is the driest and coldest continent on Earth that is covered by ice. It is the fifth largest continent based on size.

90% of the world's ice comes from Antarctica. There is as much ice in Antarctica as there is water in the Atlantic Ocean.
