To convert a sentence into past tense, we must change the verb 'to be' and the main verb.

For past tense verb 'to be', we use 'was' for first person singular and third person singular. We use 'were' for third person plural.

• I was

- He was
- She was
- It was
- They were
- We were
 - You were

The main verb must be changed into continuous tense also. Continuous verbs end in 'ing'.
