When using comparative adjectives, we can use much, so much, a lot, even, or far to enhance it.

- He was so much taller than her.
- There was a lot more food on her plate than his plate.

We can also use almost, nearly, not quite, roughly, more or less or about with 'as... as' and the 'the same as'.

- He is almost as tall as me.
- She is more or less the same height as her.
- He is nearly the same height as him.
