

Primary Grammar: Conditional Sentences

We use the conditional **'if'** for sentences with two parts, that shows a condition on which the result depends on. The condition is normally preceded by **'if'**.

We can use **'if'** in the beginning or middle of conditional sentences. When used in the middle, you do not need a coma. Read the examples below.

- He can play **if** he is good.
- We can watch TV **if** we finish our homework.
- **If** he eats a lot, he will get fat.
- **If** we work hard, we will get good grades.

We can also use **'when'**, **'whenever'** or **'every time'** instead of **'if'**.

- **When** he is good, he can play.
- **Whenever** we finish our homework, we can watch TV.
- **Every time** we work hard, we will get good grades.
