We use the conditional 'if' for sentences with two parts, that shows a condition on which the result depends on. The condition is normally preceded by 'if'.

We can use 'if' in the beginning or middle of conditional sentences. When used in the middle, you do not need a coma. Read the examples below.

- He can play if he is good.
- We can watch TV if we finish our homework.
- If he eats a lot, he will get fat.
- If we work hard, we will get good grades.

We can also use 'when', 'whenever' or 'every time' instead of 'if'.

- When he is good, he can play.
- Whenever we finish our homework, we can watch TV.
- Every time we work hard, we will get good grades.
