**May** is used to express possibility or permission.

- Look at the clouds! It may rain today.
- May I have another?

**Might** is used to express a smaller possibility.

- We might go on holiday if I can get time off.
- I might get a good grade.

**Must** is used to express a requirement.

- We must do our homework.
- I must take the medicine to get better.
